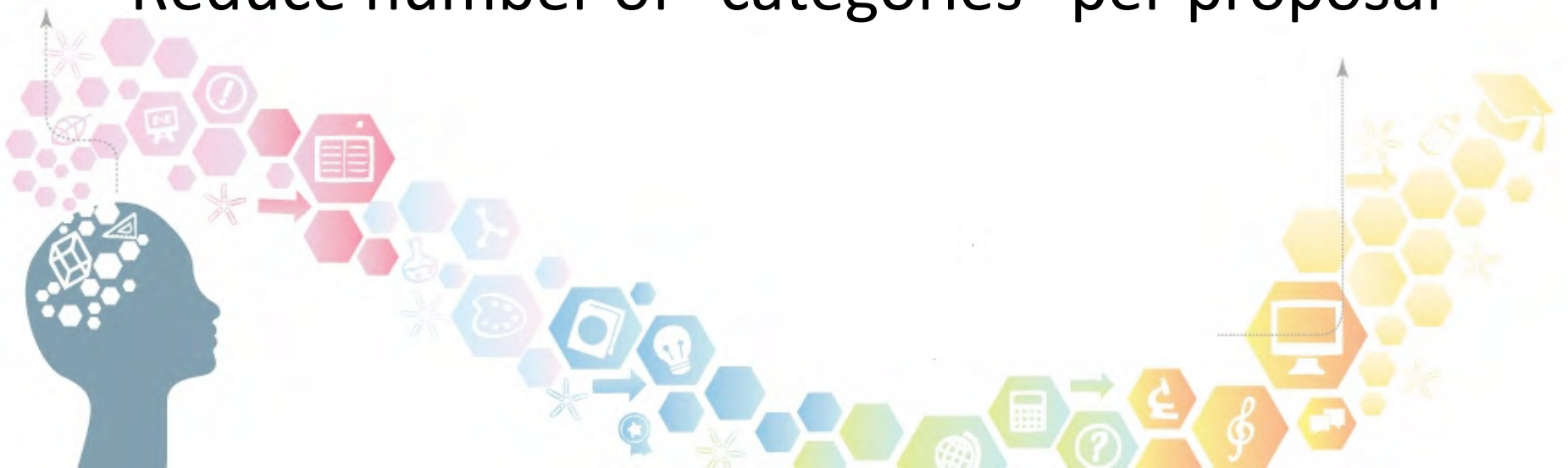

Proposal Process

- Proposals submitted on website
April 15 through June 15
- Request all information needed at beginning
- Provide downloadable submission “guide”
- Reduce number of “categories” per proposal

 - Building Leaders (27 - 32%)
 - District Leaders (45 - 50%)
 - State Leaders (5 - 7%)
 - Other Leaders (2 - 3%)

Grading Rubric

- Provides consistency to grading process
- Makes selection criteria clear to submitters
- Identifies program priorities from year to year



Rubric for 2014 Conference

- Proposal focuses on a key area of interest for Conference Attendees (10 pts)
- Proposal includes current, meaningful content (10 pts)
- Session Type is appropriate for the content described (5 pts)
- Research base listed is appropriate for topic area (10 pts)
- Presenter has relevant expertise in this topic (10 pts)
- Presenter prior presentation experience is adequate (10 pts)
- Bonus points (5 pts)



Proposed Rubric for 2015 Conference

- Proposal focuses on a key area of interest for Conference Attendees (10 pts)
- Proposal includes timely and meaningful content (10 pts)
- Proposal highlights current, successful, evidence-based Title I programs (10 pts)
- Research base listed is appropriate for topic area (10 pts)
- Content is appropriate for the identified audience (5 pts)
- Presenter has relevant expertise & speaking experience for this topic (10 pts)
- Bonus points (5 pts)
