Session Description:
 Problems with proficiency, attendance, drop-out, and administrator turn-over led Nash-Rocky Mount Public Schools to restructure its alternative program using the SIG Transformation model. The newly reorganized Tar River Academy, a priority school, hired a principal with experience working with high-risk populations. Tar River Academy serves middle and high school students and includes a day treatment component. Creative instructional strategies increased proficiency. Staff members assigned as advisors to individual students increased attendance and engagement. Community and parent partnerships improved through outreach programs and student support groups. The outcome: graduation rates soared!
