## **Meeting Agenda**

1. Review the article on convening: <u>Gather</u>
Mike Radke briefly described the convening concept and how it might be incorporated into the 2017 Conference. He asked for ideas from committee members on tonic areas, as the convening will need to be parrowed down to a very large.

members on topic areas, as the convening will need to be narrowed down to a very specific topic. The Committee spent some time discussing common issues that Title I schools in their states are facing, which might be addressed by during the convening process. Some of the largest problems schools are facing:

- Designing quality programs to help students succeed
- Teacher Expertise
- Supplement not Supplant

Teacher Retention Quality was selected as one of the main challenges that might be addressed by convening. In order to structure this into a convening, individual schools or districts would need to be identified and invited to participate. The key is selecting the problem to solve and then gathering the specific groups who are facing the challenge, along with those who are "experts" on the issue. They would work together in a workshop setting to co-create concrete, unique solutions for the schools or districts. The convening would be an extended session, a minimum of four hours, up to eight hours over two days. Advance sign-ups would be needed and only specific groups would be invited to participate. A convening session would need to be longer in order cover all the problems and complexities of the root cause, key drivers, barriers, etc, of the issue.

The committee also discussed the new ESSA law and how there will be a great deal of clarification needed about it over the next two or three years. This topic is more conducive to a traditional session, where the USED staff are invited to present and exchange information with attendees. This would not work as a convening topic, but these types of traditional conference sessions and the convening session would be offered simultaneously.



- 2. The theme for 2017 is about engagement, the design thinking presents another option that has some proven success in engaging students.
