Conference Registrations

As of January 19:

- 2634 Attendees have registered – (11% ahead of last year)
- 210 exhibit booths sold – (7.1% ahead of last year)

Opening Keynote: Daniel Jocz



- 2016 California Teacher of the Year
- One of four finalists for National Teacher of the Year
- Currently teaches Social Studies at a Los Angeles school in which 81% of the students are eligible for Title I services
- His keynote address focuses on what instruction looks like in a 21st century Title I classroom
- Emphasis on rethinking how we use data and redefining how we look at literacy

Keynote: Pedro Noguera

- Distinguished Professor of Education at the Graduate School of Education and Information Studies at UCLA
- Recently received awards for his research and advocacy efforts aimed at fighting poverty
- His presentation will describe strategies that have proven effective elsewhere at supporting teaching and learning in public schools



Keynote: Connie Rice

- A civil rights lawyer who engineers systemic fixes to entrenched inequality and injustice
- Named one of the top ten most influential attorneys in California
- Her keynote address explores how education influences and informs social justice movements/ protests and vice versa



Keynote: Eduardo Briceño



- Co-Founder & CEO of Mindset Works
- Mindset Works provides in-person, digital and printed growth mindset trainings and resources to thousands of schools and their teachers and students.
- His presentation will examine the growth mindset, which is needed to engage students and to unleash their motivation and self-efficacy.

Keynote: Chezare A. Warren

- Assistant Professor at Michigan State University
- He lectures nationally on factors that produce high academic outcomes for students of color, particularly Black males in urban K-12 and postsecondary education contexts.
- His presentation will feature findings from his research on teacher empathy in multicultural classroom contexts and the utility of this construct to (re)humanize teaching and learning practices.



Committee Role at the Conference

Communities In Schools (CIS) works inside schools to forge community partnerships that bring resources in and remove barriers to student learning. Integrated Student Supports (ISS) are provided in each school through a single point of contact—the Site Coordinator. The CIS model of ISS uses Early Warning Indicators to identify students at greatest risk and work with them to understand and address the underlying causes of academic challenges, absenteeism, and social emotional challenges. This session will use data from the CIS network, specifically North East ISD, to share promising practices for supporting schools, staff, and students for academic success in a cost-effective way. The presentation will introduce an evidence-based model that highlights Title I, outline how districts can partner with communities to connect students and families with the supports they need to show up to school ready to learn, and highlight the positive impact of Integrated Student Supports.
